

# France tourist visa application process

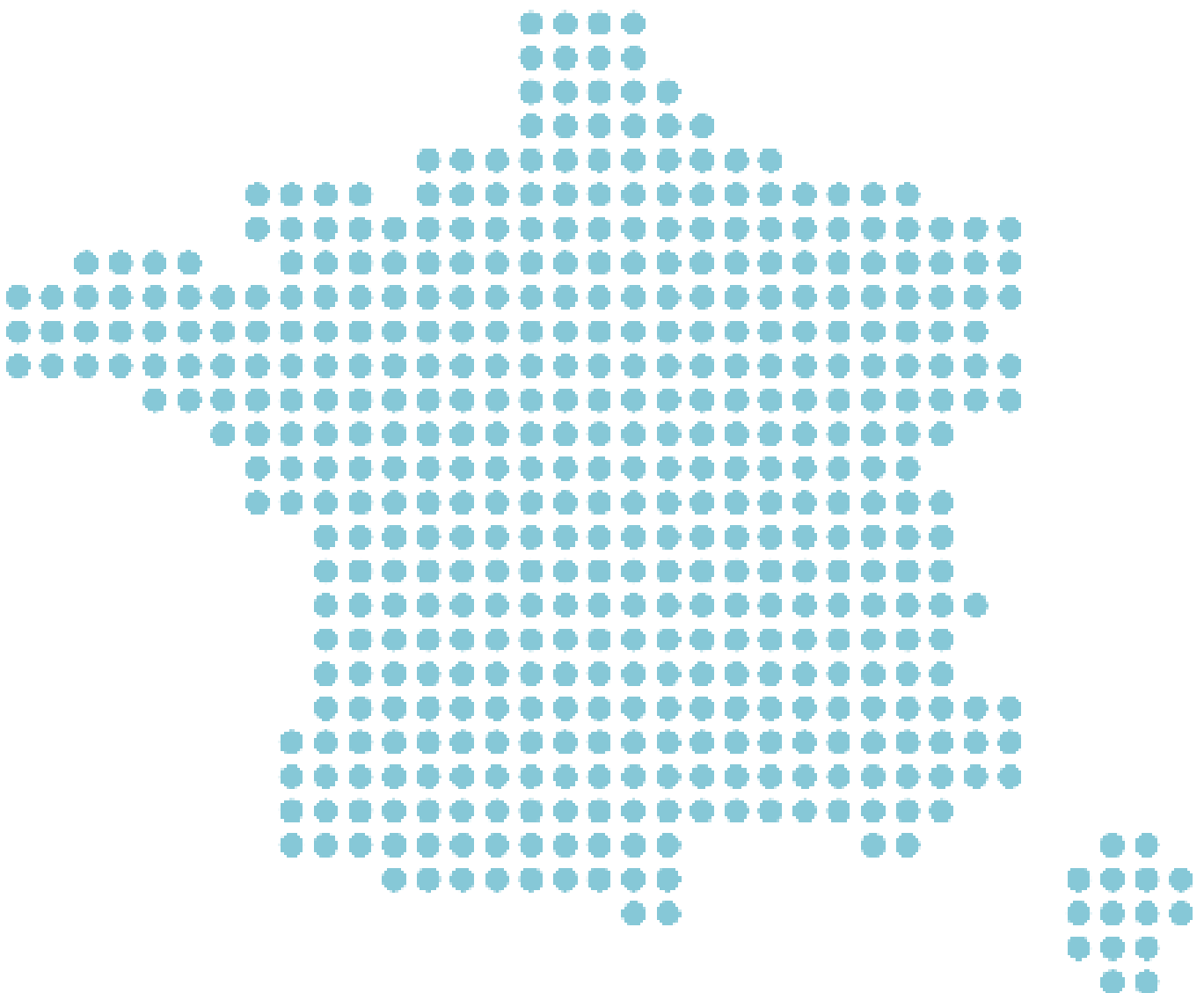

# France Student Visa Interview questions

When submitting the requirements to the French embassy, you have to go through an interview. The authorities will ask about the purpose of your visit. They want to make sure your pure intention is to study. Also, they investigate to know you do not have any criminal intention. So, it is essential that you give true and honest answers. Successful applicants say knowing a bit French would help. It would make a good first impression. Even if your course is in English, try to learn how to greet in French.

The authorities will ask various questions. A few samples of them could be as follows:



- Where do you live?
- Your family
- Parents
- Your parents' job
- Siblings (if any)
- The city you live in
- Interests and hobbies.
- Education background
- Certificates or diplomas you have achieved.
- Your work experience.
- Who don't you continue your education in your home country?
- Can you provide your CV/Resume?
- How do you intend to pay for your expenses in France?
- Do you have any scholarships?
- Who will pay for your expenses in France?
- What is your sponsor's occupation?
- How much does your sponsor earn?
- How much should you have for your studies in France?
- Your tuition fees?
- Your current bank statements.
- Do you have anyone living in France or any EU country? If yes, give some information about them.
- Your language proficiency certificates.
- Do you have anyone to sponsor you in case you need help?
- Have you ever been to France or the EU?
- Why have you chosen France to continue your education?
- What was your reason to choose this French university (or Institution)?
- How did you hear about this French university?
- What do you know about this French university?
- Have you applied to any other French university? What was their answer?
- Have you applied to a university in other countries?
- Do you know anyone in the French university you have applied to?

- Do you need to work in France while studying?
- What will you do during your summer vacation? Will you go home or will you stay in France?
- What impact does this course have on your future career?
- What do you wish to do after finishing your education in France?
- Do you work? If yes, why do you wish to leave your current job?
- Why do you think the French authorities should let you study in France?
- Do you think you deserve to study in France?

**Note:** The provided questions are only a sample. The embassy's officials might ask more. Leave a little possibility for it. The officials could ask any questions. The essential point is the answer you give them. Work on your answers. You should give them smart-wise answers. Bear in mind that you have to convince them to grant you a visa.
